## Comprehension

### Q.1) In the first stanza, what two actions does the speaker engage in?

**Answer:**

The beginning of either a fiction or poetry is of prime importance to grab the attention of the reader. The first stanza of the poem is quite motivating. In this stanza, the poet is busy in performing two major activities at the same time i.e. contemplating and seeing. He is in woods near his pal's house, thinking about his friend who is not physically present there as well as he is spellbound in watching the breathtaking scenic beauty of the woods with snow all around giving it a fairytale ambience.

### Q.2) What internal conflict do the actions create?

**Answer:**

There exists a hidden internal conflict in the actions of the poet. Actually, he knows it very well that his friend or the person to whom the woods belong, is not around but still he is thinking to meet him. That's why he is standing and waiting for him.

### Q.3) Describe the time and place of the poem.

**Answer:**

The setting of the poem is precisely appealing to the one who loves winters, its loneliness and natural objects associated with the season. Time and place are specified in the title of the poem i.e. it was a snowy evening and night was just about to engulf everything that surrounded the poet. The place was the woods concealed with snow, where the poet was standing and contemplating along with his horse.

### Q.4) How does the description of the time affect the meaning of the poem?

**Answer:**

The time mentioned in the poem is emphasizing the dark side of life i.e. death. It is creating a depressive environment for the one who is experiencing dejected feelings and emotions.

### Q.6) What sights and sounds does the speaker describe?

**Answer:**

The first sight that captures the poet's attention is the pristine beauty of the woods covered in snow. The expression "woods fill up with snow" implies that not only the ground but even the trees, their branches and leaves, are blanketed with snow. The view of the frozen lake is another sight that attracts the poet's attention. It highlights the point that it is freezing cold.

The first sound is the jingle of the harness bell tied to the horse's neck which rings aloud in the isolated place. The only other sound is the sweep of easy wind and downy flake. The poet mentions this sound to emphasize the calmness of the scene. There was complete silence and peace in the woods.

**Answer:**

The speaker was a nature lover. He stopped in the woods as he was hypnotized with the magnificence of the woods amalgamated with the snow all around adding more beauty to the picturesque canvas with the light brush of silver coat (snow).

### **Q.7) Paraphrase the second stanza of the poem.**

**Answer:**

The opening line of second stanza clears the fact that he is not alone, he is on horseback. Even the opening line shows that the horse has got the sense of perceptibility and the horse knows the fact very clear that it is unusual to stop at a place. It shows that the author also knows how the horse may assume. It is queer only because the speaker stopped at a place where there is no farmhouse near. We are very clear about the position of the poet. He stands between the frozen lake and the woods. Then the poet goes on describing how dark the evening was. He concludes the evening to be the darkest evening of the year.

### **Q.8) Scan the poem showing syllabic division and stress pattern.**

**Answer:**

**Syllabic division:**

This poem is astonishingly simple: in sixteen lines, there is not a single three-syllable word and only sixteen two-syllable words.

**Stress Pattern:**

The poem consists of four (almost) identically constructed stanzas. Each line is iambic, with four stressed syllables: Within the four lines of each stanza, the first, second, and fourth lines rhyme. The third line does not, but it sets up the rhymes for the next stanza. For example, in the third stanza, queer, near, and year all rhyme, but lake rhymes with shake, mistake, and flake in the following stanza.

The notable exception to this pattern comes in the final stanza, where the third line rhymes with the previous two and is repeated as the fourth line.

### **Q.9) Do you think any "alliteration" has been used in the poem?**

**Answer:**

Yes, some alliteration has been used in following lines of the poem:

In my point of view, winters exhibit more negative effects as **compared** to the positive ones. First and the foremost effect is that heart attacks increase in frequency during the winter months usually affecting those who already have an underlying health problem. A drop in temperature increases blood pressure so placing more strain on the heart; also your body works harder to generate additional heat when it is cold. Apart from heart attack, there are a number of diseases that are closely associated to winters like frost nip and frost bite, hypothermia, immersion foot / trench foot etc. Secondly, children and teenagers are restricted to their homes due to cold outside. Their parents don't let them play outdoor games or any other fun activities. In order to value Allah's blessings we should welcome winters with open arms as it has positive effects on our lives along with the negative ones.

This moment of contemplation is a small joy among the daily workload, personal dealings, and responsibility.

**Answer:**

The place that is described in the poem is representing a gloomy, isolated place with few dwelling and snow covered natural beauty. It is totally opposite to the one where I live, as I reside in a busy city with broad roads, noisy traffic, winter without snow, jam-packed residential area and flood of people all around. Only in one way, it is somehow like my place as there are plenty of trees in my street and the locality but they are all

green except in autumn season when some have to stand bare for sometime to welcome the coming spring.

Andrew Young has written a spectacular poem depicting the end of heavy winter with the beginning of spring to spread colors and life all around. He has used various signs that are the true reflection of the smooth transition of weather from cold to the colorful surroundings such as:

- The birth of the fresh unchristened things including leaf, spathe and stem are the vital signs of the approaching spring season.
- Beautiful flowers are making their appearance on the plants but no one can classify them with their names as they are too young to be identified.
- The green color of the emerging leaf just acts like a killer who is about to take life of the brown ones from the trees.

### **Q.5) Write about the pleasures and discomforts of winter.**

**Answer:**
